After 5 years at the Kalamazoo Nature Center, 2017 was our 10<sup>th</sup> festival downtown at the Radisson. We strive every year to bring a mix of new and traditional talent from a variety of American musical genres. We have presented bluegrass, blues, folk, swing, French Canadian, celtic, and singersongwriters, from our surrounding area to Italy and France.

Over the years the Cooper's Glen line-up has included Dr. Ralph Stanley, Bill Staines, Chris Hillman and Herb Pedersen, Larry Cordle, May Erlewine and Seth Bernard, Liz Carroll, Miss Tess and the Talkbalks, Billie Joe Shaver, Genticorum, Rhonda Vincent, Beppe Gambetta, Rev. Robert Jones, Peter Madcat Ruth, Lynn Morris, Jim Hurst, Anne Hills, Black Jake and the Carnies, Laurie Lewis and Tom Rozum and the Kalamazoo Mandolin Orchestra, just to name a few! Cooper's Glen has evolved into a wonderful gathering for musicians, luthiers, vendors, and music lovers of all ages. We offer our audiences opportunities to enjoy performances and also interact with performers through intimate workshops.

Cooper's Glen happens because of a dedicated group of board members, committee members, and volunteers who care deeply about the GLAMA's dedication to preserve, promote, and perform acoustic music. Today, music can be digitally accessed and listened to with the touch of a finger. But there is no substitute for live music, performed or played with, or for, a live audience. Each performance is different. Each audience is different. Those of you who attend Cooper's Glen are witness to and supporters of that! In addition to Cooper's Glen, GLAMA presents opportunities for participation with our regularly scheduled jams and community sings.

Every year, we receive generous support from our volunteers who offer their time and talents for the festival. We have also been fortunate to receive financial and in-kind support from businesses and our

The cost of putting on Cooper's Glen has gradually increased. Marketing expenses, venue rental, artist fees (including hotel rooms and hospitality) and sound reinforcement are not being off-set with ticket sales. We are facing the decision to downsize the festival and to raise more funds.
